



ACADEMIC GUIDANCE AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT

They are available to and to interpret college regulations and requirements. Counselors and Major Fact Sheets help students plan their academic program, overseeing the progress of students from the time they enroll. They advise students about independent study, graduate school options. At Sy Syms, each semester, students' registration is supervised by an academic adviser. Advisers in both Stern College and Stern University advise all juniors and seniors to provide them with a formal overview of graduation requirements. The Academic Advisement Center provides a range of services, including peer tutoring, to help students improve their performance.

Pre-Health Students interested in health-related fields should consult with a health sciences adviser, or with an academic advisor, for long-range planning during their first year on campus. During the junior and senior years, they should attend advisory meetings dealing with preparedness for health professions and the application process, and professional school selection. In addition, students should visit the individual Web sites of the schools to which they will be applying to learn the requirements.

Pre-Law Students considering graduate study in law should consult with an academic adviser during their freshman year. Intensive guidance services for the Law School Admissions Test, the application process, and law school selection are provided during the junior and senior years.

Pre-Engineering Students considering the Combined Plan in Engineering should consult with an academic adviser during their freshman year.
